

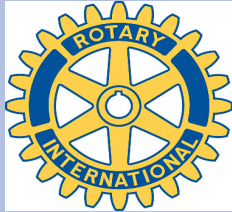

BARRY COPELAND OF THE BIRMINGHAM BUSINESS ALLIANCE TO DISCUSS HIGHWAY 280

On Monday, June 7, Barry Copeland, Senior Vice President-Operations of the Birmingham Business Alliance (BBA), will present a program titled “US Highway 280: An Update.”

The issue of traffic congestion on US 280 is, unfortunately, something with which most of us are familiar. The State of Alabama has proposed a solution to the problem, a citizens group has proposed an alternative solution, cities along the corridor are taking positions on what they believe should be done, and the traffic is still as congested as ever.

Barry monitors this issue for the BBA and will present an update on the problem and will answer your questions about proposed solutions.

In his position as Senior Vice President, he is responsible for the Finance, Investor Relations and Information Technology operations of the BBA, which is the successor organization to the former Birmingham Regional Chamber of Commerce and the Birmingham Metropolitan Development Board.

Before taking his current position, Barry was Executive Vice President of the Chamber, joining that team in 2001. That followed a 17-year career with BellSouth, where he served as Regional Director for External Affairs in the Birmingham metro area.

He was also the News Director of Birmingham television station NBC

He has served as board chairman of several key community agencies, including Operation New Birmingham, the Literacy Council of Central Alabama, the Metropolitan Arts Council and Birmingham’s Downtown City Center Partnership. He currently serves on the Board of Advisors of the College of Communication and Information Sciences at the University of Alabama and as a board member of the Sloss Furnaces Foundation.

Barry was a member of the 1991 class of Leadership Birmingham and the 1999 class of Leadership Alabama.

He is a graduate of the University of Alabama, holding both bachelors and masters degrees in Communications. He has also

completed a postgraduate course of study in the executive education program of New York’s Columbia University School of Business.

Barry is a member of the Rotary Club of Birmingham, and he is a generational Rotarian. Both he and his father, the late Dr. O. B. Copeland, were members of this club for many years. Barry is a Paul Harris Fellow.

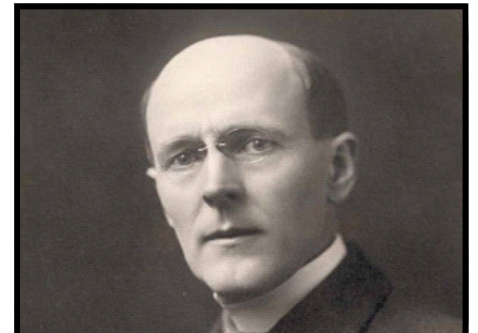
